


CHIEF JUDGE ORDER 21-06 COURT OPERATIONS BEGINNING MAY 4, 2021		


As of May 2, 2021, the two graphs below reflect the current relatively high rate of Covid-19 incidence in El Paso and Teller Counties:

Also, El Paso County is experiencing an increasingly high hospitalization rate due to Covid-19:



As of April 26, 2021 Teller County had three people hospitalized due to Covid-19. (https://covid19.colorado.gov/data).

As of May 2, 2021, approximately 32% of the El Paso County population eligible to receive the Covid-19 vaccine has been fully vaccinated. (https://covid19.colorado.gov/vaccine-data-dashboard)

As of May 2, 2021, approximately 35% of the Teller County population eligible to receive the Covid-19 vaccine has been fully vaccinated. (https://covid19.colorado.gov/vaccine-data-dashboard)

In addition, as of May 2, 2021, El Paso County has the second highest rate of Covid-19 variant cases in Colorado, with 411 cases, behind only Larimer County (Fort Collins). (https://covid19.colorado.gov-data)

On May 2, 2021, Governor Polis extended the State's mask-wearing requirement for another 30 days. As of April 15, 2021, the State of Colorado no longer has a statewide order in place for six-foot social distancing where fewer than 100 people are in a room.

The CDC, however, provides clear guidance on the "How to Protect Yourself & Others" section of its website. (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html.)

The CDC-recommended protective measures continue to include:

- Wearing a mask;
- Staying at least six feet away from others who do not live with you;
- Avoiding crowds;
- Washing your hands frequently;
- Avoiding poorly ventilated spaces.

In light of the above information and to ensure the safety of everyone coming to the El Paso County and Teller County courthouses, and pursuant to the authority granted in Chief Justice Directive 95-01 and the Orders Regarding COVID-19 and Operation of Colorado State Courts issued by former Colorado Supreme Court Chief Justice Nathan B. Coats, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- That anyone in the El Paso County and Teller County courthouses shall continue to wear masks.
- That anyone in the El Paso County and Teller County courthouses shall continue to maintain six-foot distancing from those who are not members of the same household.

1. Courthouse Operations: The El Paso County and Teller County Courthouses will remain closed to the public <u>EXCEPT</u> as to Public Safety Matters, as set forth in Section 6 of this Order, and <u>EXCEPT</u> as to:

A. Contested evidentiary hearings in <u>Criminal and Juvenile Delinquency</u> <u>cases</u> where mask and social distancing requirements can be strictly complied with;

B. Sentencing hearings where a <u>Department of Corrections prison sentence</u> is a sentencing option for the court and where mask and social distancing requirements can be strictly complied with;

C. Contested evidentiary hearings in <u>Domestic Relations</u>, <u>Probate</u>, and <u>Juvenile cases</u> (other than those referred to in Section 1.A. of this order), where the court concludes that conducting a hearing by telephone or Webex would be <u>impractical</u> and where mask and social distancing requirements can be strictly complied with;

D. Probation supervision matters where the Probation Department or a Probation Officer has requested a meeting in person and where mask and social distancing requirements can be strictly complied with; and

E. Exceptions set forth in "Teller County Court Covid-19 Order re: Evictions and Civil Cases."

2. ALL OTHER COURTROOM PROCEEDINGS shall occur by Webex or telephone, except as set forth in Section 6 of this order.

- 3. For only those public safety filings listed in Section 6 of this Order, the El Paso County and Teller County Clerk of Court's Offices will be open from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, with the exception of legal holidays. All other paper filings shall be mailed directly to the courthouse, dropped into the drop-off box at the main entrance to the El Paso County Courthouse, or e-filed through the Colorado Courts E-filing system (CCE).
- **4.** Jury trials for all district court and county court case classes shall continue as they have since March 8, 2021.

5. Parties without attorneys shall contact the court clerk for the division where their case is pending to receive further directions. A list of division phone numbers is attached to this order. A list of the Court's division phone numbers can also be found at:

In leaving any voicemail message, parties without attorneys shall include their first and last names, their phone number, their email, and a case number, if available.

Defendants may also contact division staff by sending an email to the Court at 4thclerkofcourt@judicial.state.co.us. Email correspondence will then be forwarded to the appropriate division.

Failure by an unrepresented criminal defendant to contact the division clerk by Webex, phone, or email within 24 hours after any scheduled court date may result in the issuance of an arrest warrant.

If the division clerk gives an unrepresented criminal defendant a new court date by telephone, the division clerk shall order the defendant to appear by Webex or telephone on that next court date. Any such defendants shall immediately notify their bondsmen that their bond has been continued until the next court date.

Any bondsman who objects to any procedure of continuing bonds set forth in this Order shall promptly communicate in writing to Chief Judge Bain the nature of the objection.

6. Public Safety Matters: The El Paso and Teller County Courthouses will continue to accept filings and conduct limited hearings on public safety matters. Whenever practical, these proceedings shall occur by Webex or phone.

Public safety matters are limited to the following:

- **A.** Petitions for temporary civil protection orders and permanent protection order hearings;
- **B.** Petitions and hearings for temporary emergency risk protection orders and emergency risk protection orders;
- C. Crim. P. Rule 5 advisements (bonded or video advisement in the duty division);
- **D.** Revocation hearings on complaints to revoke probation involving an incarcerated defendant;
- E. Proceedings necessary to protect the constitutional rights of criminal defendants, including bond-related matters and plea agreements for incarcerated individuals;
- F. Juvenile detention and advisement hearings for juvenile delinquency cases;
- G. Shelter hearings in dependency and neglect cases;
- **H.** Petitions for appointment of an emergency guardian and/or special conservator and hearings related to same;
- I. Hearings on motions to restrict parenting time and parental abduction prevention;
- J. Emergency mental health filings and proceedings; and
- K. Other proceedings deemed necessary and exceptional by the Chief Judge.

- 7. Social Distancing: When hearings or trials under Sections 1, 4, or 6 of this order are conducted anywhere in the El Paso County or Teller County Courthouses, judicial officers and court staff shall limit in-person participation and shall follow all mask and social-distancing requirements.
- 8. Self-Help Centers: The self-help center at the El Paso County Courthouse is closed to inperson help until further notice. - 9. Probation: The probation staff is conducting most business by phone or video Probation Officer directly email Please call your conferencing. firstname.lastname@judicial.state.co.us, or you can contact the Probation Department main office at 719-452-5900 or 04probation@judicial.state.co.us. If the court or someone from probation has informed you to report in person, our lobby hours are Monday-Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. Voicemails and emails are checked daily; when leaving a message, please indicate the level of urgency of your situation. Due to a high volume of calls and emails, please allow 24 hours for a response prior to contacting the Probation Department again.
